# Minutes of last meeting (15th May)

#### Welcome

## **Head of Schools' Report (Howard Stribbell)**

- Enrolment for next year is higher than we were anticipating and budgeted. Our budget is 13,035 and we are currently at 13,030. This does not include kids who will be going through the summer time.
- We are all good for staff. Actual capacity is 14,050 with the current staffing level.
- Summer school is exceptionally full. The Early Bird ended last week. Last year was 320 in elementary. This year is 450. Last year in secondary was 15. This year is 30. Total of 480 kids already signed up. We will pass the 500 mark.
- Child Protection Seminar this morning and another one this afternoon. Very helpful to get feedback from the parents and to see it from their perspective. We will continue to refine and implement it. Some changes for next year are the designated washrooms. A Child Washroom or an Adult Washroom. Explicit signage that we are a child safe school. Continue to review the security protocols. Share the PANTS program with parents. PANTS is the program we use for the kindergarten.
- Alberta Accreditation Education Report. A positive report overall. For Requirements: Update our teacher evaluation tool as Alberta have changed some of their requirements on what teachers have to do. As a larger leadership team we have been looking at our teacher evaluation and how do we make sure that it is comprehensive and fits our context. There are the formal Teacher Quality Standards. We also wanted a system in place where we assess whether the teacher is a good fit for TIS. The leadership team has been working on providing a new protocol and tool to evaluate. We are also looking at who is involved in the evaluations. Up until now it has been the Principal and Vice Principal. We evaluate formally 3 times per year. Being a collaborative school we want it to be a collaborative process.
- Recommendations from the report: Continue to manage transitions for the new leadership changes for the Head of School and Secondary Principal. Address the facilities in the South Wing. Over the next two years we are replacing the projectors to short throw interactive projectors. Last summer a big painting project was done. Review the IB implementation.

- TIS will be recommended for the Tier 4 level of the Alberta Accreditation which is the highest level. TIS will be the only school to achieve the level out of all of the Alberta International Schools. That is based on academic results, collaboration with other schools, extra curriculum activities and professional learning.
- Focusing on more Community Outreach activities as a school next year.
- Next year looking at an Activist in Residence Program. There would be a strong literacy piece attached to it. Will help kids understand how do we make the world a better place and what is their role in it. That would be in the Fall. Then in the Spring looking at addressing the food wastage in our own lives and especially in the school. A comprehensive program that would measure how much food is being wasted and identify what we could do with it. That would be a school wide initiative. TISPA maybe able to assist with that.
- Experience Week with the CAST Program having a service component attached to it.

# **Principal's Reports**

# **Elementary (Mary-Anne Jasinski)**

- In elementary next year there will be two Family Service trips. One during Fall break and the next during Spring break.
- Working on the Summer School getting all the registrations in place. Exciting that we have so many kids. For a lot of the new students coming in next year, a condition of their acceptance was that they attend Summer School with the intent that that helps the transition into the new school. Will be easier and give them a less stressful period of a few weeks to adjust.
- Finalising Class List for next year. Each grade is preparing lists for proposals for the following grade. Breaking the children into groups depending on the number of teachers in the receiving grade. It's actually a really involved process and a lot of thought goes into how we place kids. Looking at learning styles, friendships to make sure everyone has a good connection with someone in the class they are going into. Combining kids into good groups so that the classroom is cohesive and positive. We don't accept parent's request for a particular teacher as there is a lot of planning.
- Mr. Stribbell advised that teachers do not even know who they have in their class until a week before school starts.

It is supervised by one of the Academic Councillor or teacher. For example for Work Experience a few students have decided to be Classroom Helpers. They go into elementary classrooms and work with the teachers and help. It is on an ongoing basis throughout the course of the year. They have to establish clear goals as to what they want to get out of the experience. Example of a Passion Project is one grade 12 set out to make a movie. Going through the process of coming up with an idea. Writing the script. Using the picture boards. Planning out the schedule when filming. Then making the movie which was really good.
- Mr. Coates on a personal item being his last meeting wanted to thank TISPA. Mr. Coates has been very impressed over the past 2 years with the positivity of everyone and the level of support. The best example Mr. Coates can think of is the House System. This was a new initiative intended to build community and school morale. It was a big undertaking. To get TISPA's support for the program and in particular to get it up and running off the ground. Getting everyone their house shirts. TISPA was so ready and willing to step up and put many of their resources towards that.
